<i>Note: Formal complaints consist of allegations such as violations of law other than minor traffic offenses, excessive force, or intentional policy violations that resulted in serious injury or death. They may be generated by a citizen complaint or they may be internally generated.</i>	

Disciplinary Actions:

Sustained informal complaints resulted in a range of disciplinary actions including, training, counseling, reprimands, and loss of pay based on the principles of progressive discipline.

Sustained formal complaints resulted in one termination, one suspension without pay, and one reprimand. The level of discipline was determined based on the severity of the offense and the principles of progressive discipline
